(in the premises of Scientific Research Centre in Ljubljana)



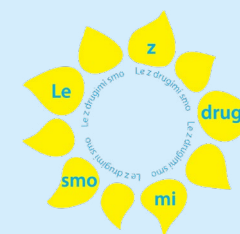
